

## Grandview Plaza City Council

Met in Regular Session June 21, 2016 at 6:30 PM

Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm, by Mayor Rick Geike. Present were council members Honey Grant, Marvin Edison, Jack Rider, Robert Rodney and Gary Sacher. Also present was Roger Unruh, Janet Young, Jerome Thomas, Chief Shawn Peirano, Officer Joshua Williams, and Allen Rothlisberg.

Mayor Geike led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Honey Grant led the Invocation.

Gary Sacher made a motion to approve the May 16, 2016 minutes. Jack Rider seconded the motion. Motion carried, vote unanimous.

Dan Hoffman addressed the council about the 2017 budget. A special meeting was set up for July 12, 2016 for department heads and Dan to present their budgets for 2017 to the council.

Jerome Thomas advised the council that the street work has been completed except for pot holes on Castle, Robert, and Riverview. 2) Jerome advised the salt shelter has been moved over. 3) Jerome advised the council that on July 26, 2016 there would be a meeting on the sewer grants in Topeka. Gary Sacher made motion that if anyone from council attended this meeting with Jerome can turn in receipts for food and be reimbursed. Jack Rider seconded the motion. Motion carried, vote unanimous. 4) Jerome advised the council that 100 E Anchor was given until June 29, 2016 to complete the process of demolition. Jerome advised that 120 Flint Street will be demolished per the bid from Glessner. Jerome present a letter from Colin Glessner asking for 30 days to purchase the property at 400 Plaza and demolish the trailer. Marvin Edison made a motion to allow the extra 30 days. Gary Sacher seconded the motion. Motion carried, vote unanimous. 5) Jerome Thomas showed the council photographs from 120 Byrd Street and requested that it be demolished. Marvin Edison made a motion to pass Resolution 16-07, to begin the demolition process on 120 Byrd Street. Jack Rider seconded the motion, motion carried vote unanimous.

Honey Grant brought up her concern about the storm shelter. Jerome provided the council with a photograph and quote to put up wooden benches around the walls in the shelter for a seating option. The quote was for \$1700.00 from Gomez Home Repair. Robert Rodney made a motion to get the benches put into the shelter. Honey Grant seconded the motion. Motion carried, vote unanimous.

Chief Peirano advised the council that they had responded to 528 incidents. 2) Chief Peirano advised that Officer Charlson and Officer DiPolito have started KLETC. 3) Chief Peirano advised that the new patrol vehicle was still waiting on the cage, however, everything else has been completed on it.

1) Janet Young presented the audit engagement letter to the council. Gary Sacher made a motion to approve the letter. Jack Rider seconded the motion. Motion carried, vote unanimous. 2) Janet Young presented a quote to the council from Allied Hand Dryers & Baby Stations for baby changing tables. The quote was for \$139.00 each. Jack Rider made a motion to purchase 2 baby changing stations for the shelter bathrooms. Honey Grant seconded the motion. Motion carried, vote unanimous. 3) Janet Young presented the Thank you letter from the Junction City Community Band to the council.

The council asked Jerome if he would have a fire truck in the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade. Jerome advised that he would and requested permission to purchase items to hand out to the children. Marvin Edison made a motion to allow Jerome to spend up to \$1000.00 to purchase items for the parade. Gary Sacher seconded the motion. Motion carried, vote unanimous. The council asked Chief Peirano if there would be a patrol vehicle in the parade. Chief Peirano advised that there would be.

Jack Rider moved to approve the May expenditures, seconded by Gary Sacher. Motion carried, vote unanimous.

Gary Sacher moved to approve the May financial statement, seconded by Robert Rodney. Motion carried, vote unanimous.

Honey Grant brought up an outside bulletin board. Honey Grant voiced her concerns about the ATA bus routes not posted and the Brigade baseball schedule not posted. Honey Grant was advised that neither schedule was given to the city clerk to post. Honey Grant wanted ATA bus signs to be posted at pick up points in Grandview Plaza. Allan Rothlisberg advised that Geary County had paid for the ATA bus signs in Junction City so they may put up signs in Grandview Plaza as well.

Jack Rider made a motion to adjourn. Honey Grant seconded the motion. Motion carried, vote unanimous.
